year. Chinese folk legend tells of
a minister and poet who was a
man of high moral integrity. To
protest governmental

corruption, he drowned himself in a river in southern China. The local people so loved him that they quickly deployed boats for his search. They also threw rice balls into the river so the fish would eat those instead of his body.

Thus the festival that marks the beginning of mid-summer is celebrated with dragon boat racing and eating **zong zi** – delicious balls of sticky rice, pork, and beans wrapped up in bamboo leaves. The holiday is now mainly a festive affair, but it's nice to remember its origin of poetry and honor.
